

A Book and A Prayer

Let his posterity be cut off..."

David, the only person in the scriptures called a man after God's own heart, was not turning the other cheek. Perhaps our prayers should be for a President who needs our help and who is not turning the other cheek.

The democrats are also doing their best to ignore our legal system. This too reminds me of a book I read many years ago. A book, *The Law*, written by a Frenchman, Frederic Bastiat, in 1850 as he watched the French legal system crumble.
